This question is about those aluminum ladders hanging from the docks throughout the marina.

Out of curiosity, I conducted a little survey and asked some tenants and guests why those ladders were in place.

A vast majority of those I asked, told me they are put there so that people can get in and out of their kayaks or paddle boards. Others replied that they are there for when they take a dip in the water. I have seen others use these ladders to tie their dinghies to or tie other lines to.

I can totally understand why they would think this. Unfortunately, that is not their purpose. So that we are all on the same rung, so to say, these ladders are for emergencies ONLY. Should someone accidentally fall from the pier or their vessel into the water, these are in place to assist them in getting safely out of the water.

Enjoy your kayaks and paddle boards. Just get on them from your swim step or elsewhere. Do not use the emergency ladders. And a reminder, there is no swimming in the marina.

Finally, if you have something tied to one of these ladders, please remove it. Otherwise, if we see it, we will remove it. No floats, fenders or other items can be attached to the ladders.

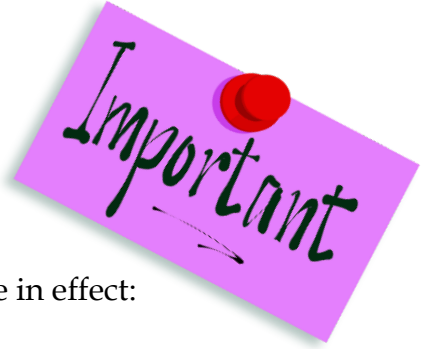

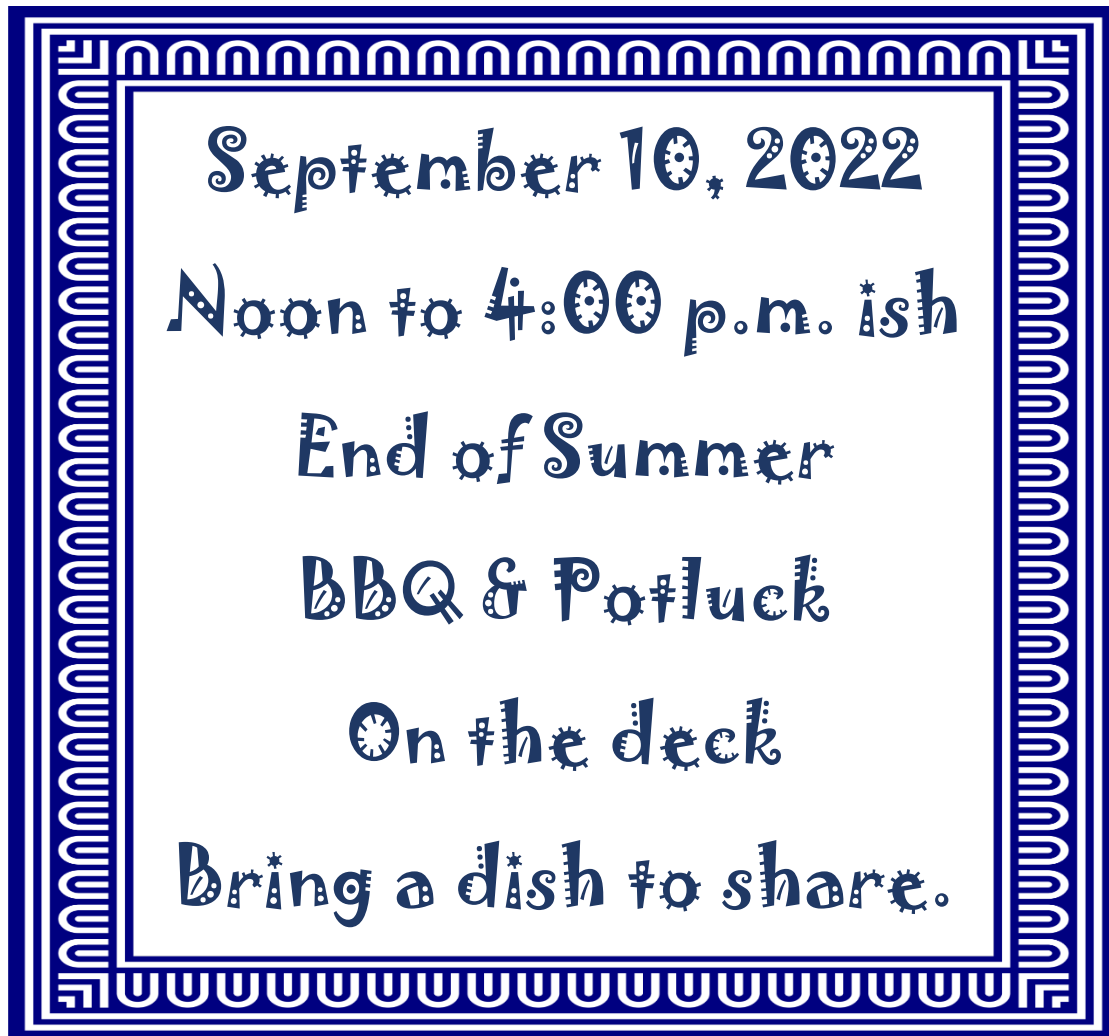


Fee Increases Effective October 1, 2022

Effective October 1, 2022, the following fee changes will be in effect:

- **Dock Box Rental:** Increase from \$12 to \$15 per month
- **Live Aboard Fee:** Increase from \$100/\$50 to \$120/\$60 per month
- **Transient Moorage Rate:** Increase from \$1.65 to \$1.75 per foot, per day
- **Transient Electric Fee:** New charge of \$5.00 per day

Live Aboard tenants and those tenants with dock boxes will see this increase on their October statement. These statements are scheduled to go out October 1, 2022.
