Fire Safety

How many times have you read the story of a boat fire in a marina that is located too close for comfort?

Scary, huh! Not to cause panic or worry, don't think we haven't been so lucky as to get away with no events. In the last three years there have been several small fires that we have caught prior to becoming BIG issues. We want to keep it that way. Sure, it would be nice for them to not happen at all. But we have 238 vessels that have fuel and other flammable materials. Add humans and mother nature to that as well as normal wear and tear. Voila! Fire hazards.

Two of our fires were jerry-rigged power cords that could not take the amps. The cords got hot, started smoking and luckily were seen, prior to flames. The worst incident was an ion battery charger left plugged in while the tenant went to work. Complete interior of the vessel was ruined.

Next to using the correct cords and equipment, the best practice is response and preparation. Throughout the marina are fire extinguishers. Please familiarize yourself with the one closest to your vessel. You should also have extinguishers on your vessel. If you don't, WHY Not?

It is important to have a marina emergency response plan. Over the next month I will be asking for volunteers from each dock to act as points of contact in the case of emergency. These volunteers would be provided the information regarding who is a live aboard on their assigned dock and any special circumstances. In case of fire or emergency such as an earthquake the volunteer would check on the live aboard on their dock and report back to me. They would also check other slips and report any issues.

I do recognize some of our tenants seek privacy and do not want their information shared. If you wish privacy, please let me know.

Once all volunteers are assigned, we will finalize the marina emergency response plan.

Here are some Boat Owner Safety Tips:

- Use Underwriter's Laboratory (UL) marine-approved cord sets and connections. Do not hook up if you see burn marks or your cord set will not firmly connect.
- Routinely replace cord sets. Worn or overloaded cord sets, and damaged shore power connections are a common cause of fires.
- Regularly inspect electrical and fuel systems. Have a professional upgrade the wiring to maintain the needs of your navigational equipment and other appliances.
- Never leave operating electrical equipment, including heaters, unattended. When leaving your boat for any reason, turn portable heaters off.
- Smoke alarms are important life-saving devices and should be installed in your boat.
- Plan your escape. Having an escape plan can save your life in an emergency.
- Have a U.S.C.G. approved fire extinguisher onboard and know how to use it. Fire extinguishers should be mounted near an exit, so you are moving toward an exit as you access the extinguisher.
- Do your part to keep the dock clean and clear. Don't leave engine parts, tools, or other equipment on the dock.
- Properly dispose of oily rags in metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Leaving oily rags wrapped up in a grocery sack is not safe. The chemicals will begin to breakdown the rags, causing heat and possibly a fire.
- Boat owners must take responsibility for preventing fires on their boats and in the marina. The most common causes of boat fires are electrical malfunctions, unattended portable heaters, and poor housekeeping.


